












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Cinema Is Our Mission

Film festivals participate in an industrial discourse, of which Locarno is an integral part being Switzerland's largest film event - a position we claim and defend. In the service of auteur cinema, in all its forms, the competition features top-tier names.

From well-established film directors, such as Hong Sang-soo, Wang Bing, Ben Rivers, Pia Marais, Silvia Luzi and Luca Bellino, in-Mar Coll and Sara Fgaier, Marta Mateus, Sylvie Ballyot, and Virgil Vernier, the competition is a deep immersion into the possibilities of Happy cinema to everyone! contemporary film language.

An ambitious competition that consciously, critically, seeks a dialogue with the audience at a time in which both history and all its stories are imperiously knocking on the doors of cinema. 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





















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

PIAZZA GRANDE

Piazza Grande is what Locarno is all about, 8,000 seats. One of the largest screens in the world. Pristine projection. Booming sound. All of it outdoors, under the stars. Throughout the Festival, awards are given to special guests onstage at Piazza Grande: some of the most prominent directors, stars, producers, or technical wizards from the world of cinema take a bow before the audience. Then there's the program itself, which consists of some of the year's most anticipated films, coming to Locarno mostly in their world or international premieres. These are films everybody can enjoy, cinephiles, genre fans, and the general audience alike. But it doesn't stop there. On certain nights a second screening takes place just before midnight, giving space to either the films of the honorees, masterpieces from out of the past, or the true genre-bending oddities.

Since 2000, the Prix du Public UBS, the only official award of the Festival to be awarded by the Piazza Grande audience, has been presented to films that are destined to become part of film history. Starting this year, it will be joined by the Letterboxd Piazza **Grande Award**, given by a jury made up of Letterboxd editorial staff and young accredited critics attending the Festival to a new feature film showing on the Piazza Grande.

RETRO-SPETTIVA

Few international festivals can claim the cultural significance of the Locarno Film Festival's famous retrospectives, which have long had a major impact on the worldwide conversation around the cinema of the past. Whether in its complete studies of major auteurs - offering the chance to absorb the complexities of a single filmmaker's artistic output in its entirety - or in canon-busting reconsiderations of national cinemas or film studios, the sprawling Retrospettiva is a beloved event for cinephiles, scholars, professionals, and the general public. And this year is no exception - with "The Lady with the Torch", the Festival will counter the received wisdom around the legendary studio Columbia Pictures during its heyday from the sound era to the late 1950s, thus marking its centenary in 2024.

The Retrospettiva, curated by Ehsan Khoshbakht, is organized by the Locarno Film Festival in partnership with the Cinémathèque suisse. The Retrospettiva is made possible by the collaboration with Sony Pictures Entertainment.

OPEN DOORS SCRENINGS

For more than two decades, the Locarno Film Festival has collaborated with the Swiss Agency for Development and Cooperation (SDC) of the Federal Department of Foreign Affairs (FDFA) on the section Open Doors, as part of Locarno Pro, whose mission is to support filmmakers from underrepresented regions around the world, and from countries in which cinema as a form of expression is at risk. From 2022 to 2024, Open Doors has focused on the 22 countries across Latin America and the Caribbean and, throughout the year and during the Festival, carries out professional promotion and training programs during the Festival and year-round. Concomitantly, the non-competitive section Open Doors Screenings offers audiences in Locarno a selection of feature-length films and shorts that are representative of the region. In 2024, the spotlight is on all regions touched by the three-year cycle: Central America, the Caribbean, and South America.



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Locarno Pro: The Cornerstone of a **Transforming Industry**

Locarno Pro, the platform that welcomes to offer a wide and diverse roster of activmore than 1,500 professionals to the Locarno Film Festival, is ready to address the most pressing issues of an industry with rapid and profound transformations at its doorstep. At the center of StepIn, our respected international think tank, a number of important issues related to artificial intelligence and the repercussions it will have on our entire ecosystem (both in the artistic sphere, with the use of generative tools, and in distribution, with potential consequences on the workflows of the entire production chain) will be addressed. With a keynote signed by Kelsey Farish (an intellectual property lawyer and expert on generative AI) and a selected panel discussion, we will delve into the opportunities and risks associated with the use of artificial systems. We will also look at the prospects for independent production in Europe, emphasizing alternatives to public funding and presenting new private funds for independent films.

After the success of the first year, we will return to organize a day dedicated to the heritage film industry, Heritage Monday, during which professionals will be able to (re)discover some masterpieces of the past in a newly restored form, as well as participate in discussions on the state of heritage film distribution and other networking events. On this occasion, we will present two films restored by the Locarno Film Festival thanks to the Heritage Online initiative and its Contest, sponsored by Cinegrell: Mulher de Verdade by Alberto Cavalcanti (Brazil, 1954) and Samba Traoré by Idrissa Ouédraogo (Burkina Faso, Switzerland, France, 1992), both in the official selection in the Histoire(s) du Cinéma - Heritage Online section.

Buoyed by the recent success of Match Me! alumnus Thomas Hakim, who produced Payal Kapadia's All We Imagine as Light (2024), winner of the Grand Prix at the Cannes Film Festival this year, Locarno Pro returns

ities that serve as incubators for emerging talent: First Look, the showcase for films in the finalization stage, will have the spotlight on Spain for its 13th edition; Match Me! will welcome 36 new faces of independent production from 14 different countries; and Alliance4Development, the co-development platform for film projects from Austria, Germany, Italy, Switzerland, and France, will present 11 new projects during its ninth edition. Special attention will, as always, be paid to the young distribution professionals (one of the most fragile groups in our industry): in fact, 10 young professionals, including distributors, salespeople, festival organizers and experts in marketing, VOD, and film programming, will be welcomed inside the Industry Academy. Another 10 participants under the age of 30 will be integrated into the U30 program, a think tank where the younger generation take the floor. With the Locarno Industry Academy and U30, we have succeeded over the years in creating a close-knit international community, thanks to the various events held throughout the year: a total of 11 industry academies and 2 U30 activities, in partnership with other festivals and events from almost all over the world. This year, to mark the Industry Academy's 10th anniversary, we will celebrate this community of young professionals more vigorously than ever, and those who cannot physically be in Locarno will still be able to access Locarno Pro Online, participating in our activities and accessing our content throughout the rest of the year.

Finally, the Locarno Pro team is delighted to celebrate 25 years of industry in Locarno together with partners and colleagues during the 77th Locarno Film Festival!

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Premieres and Big Names for the Little **Ones Too**

Who said that great cinema doesn't really need to win over the little ones? This is a question that has been crucial for unforgettable filmmakers, who have dedicated some of their greatest masterpieces to child audiences. This year, on the evening of August 4, the Prefestival presented by la Mobiliare features a great classic like Steven Spielberg's E.T. the Extra-Terrestrial (1982), a film about the friendship between an alien and a group of children that has bewitched entire generations, iconically making bicycles take flight Locarno77 with a special screening on the Pithrough the power of friendship and collaboration, in a message of hope essential for the oration with Cinemagia (ggl). times we live in.

And the magic doesn't end there. It continues with an exceptional award-winning Swiss animator: Claude Barras, filmmaker behind the celebrated Ma vie de Courgette (My Life as a Zucchini, 2016) and creator of extraordinary small worlds in stop-motion. He will collect the Locarno Kids Award la Mobiliare to 18. A range of educational and creative on the Piazza Grande and present his latest opportunities will also be offered thanks to film, Sauvages (2024), a seductive journey into the heart of the Amazon rainforest seen through the eyes of a little girl taken from her native village, which becomes a struggle against those who are endangering the future of our planet.

Green themes come together in the Locarno Kids Screenings program, which, in addition to presenting a tribute to Barras, will offer a proposal for youngsters (and others) every afternoon at the Teatro Kursaal. It begins with Nino Pagot's I fratelli Dinamite (1949), a classic of Italian animation restored by the Cineteca di Milano, and will continue with a program full of new films. From Annecy comes the cute stop-motion film Living Large (2024) by the Czech Kristina Dufková, about the difficulties of a young boy who struggles to lose weight, while from Japan comes the long-awaited anime KIMINOIRO (The Colors Within, 2024) by Naoko Yamada (known for A Silent Voice, 2016), the story of the creative friendship of a group of teenagers. Also returning to Locarno is a master of French animation, Jean-François Laguionie, who will bring to Locarno his poetic journey into the desires of a family between the

postwar period and the present day: Slocum et moi (2024). Finally, three world premiere films recount the challenges of kids today: keeping real meeting places alive (in Klemen Dvornik's Slovenian Igrišča ne damo [Block 5], 2024); rescuing animals from places where they are mistreated (in Veit Helmer's German Akiko, der fliegende Affe, 2024); and keeping one's family and network of friendships together (in Patrice Sauvé's Canadian La Petite et le vieux, 2024). Plus, we'll close azza Grande for families organized in collab-

Rounding out Locarno Edu's offerings will be a series of workshops, meetings, and labs run by educational partners, starting with the renewed collaboration between the Festival and SUPSI's Department of Education and Learning for the Movie&Media Labs: a wide range of offerings for girls and boys ages 6 valuable collaborations with Castellinaria Festival del cinema giovane, Filmkids, LAC edu, RSI EDU, and WWF. There will also be "Behind the Scenes" events organized by Cinemagia (ggl) and cultural mediation workshops curated by the team of the Locarno Film Festival. Also among the happily returning programs will be that of the third Ticino edition of the Atelier du Futur. For the little ones, there will be the usual Kids Corner, while the Rotonda by la Mobiliare will offer a space for entertainment and hanging out for the whole family.

During the rest of the year, our engagement with the youngest audiences continues thanks to initiatives such as La Giornata del Cinema, the Back to School platform, and the various other collaborations with schools and cultural mediation institutes.

In truth, not one, but many voices - diverse in geographic origin, cultural background, and artistic sensibility - come together, from August 7 to 17, 2024 in the Locarno Factory.

There are many souls that make up the Factory: the artistic residency for young talents of BaseCamp; the Festival's personal training project for young filmmakers (Filmmakers Academy), for writers on film (Critics Academy), and for film industry professionals (Industry Academy); the educational experience of the Documentary Summer **School**; the review of films produced at film, television, and animation schools in Switzerland offered by FILM FOUNDRY: Young Swiss Cinema; and the photography workshop, which this year will be hosted by German photographer Sven Creutzmann. 3 days, 6 schools, 27 films, 1 horizon: the Cinema. FILM FOUNDRY: Young Swiss Cinema, a big screen event dedicated to the work of alumni and students from Swiss film schools.

This review of films produced by Swiss film, television, and animation schools is an event that has been an integral part of the Locarno Film Festival for twelve years. CISA has coordinated this event from the beginning, inviting Swiss universities and specialized professional schools to participate with a selection of their best short films, allowing for an exchange on their respective experiences of film production, in synergy with BaseCamp. Recent diploma short films from ZHdK Zurich, HSLU Lucerne, ECAL Lausanne, HEAD Geneva and CISA will be presented alongside a selection of film essays from USI Lugano and Mendrisio.

The **Zurich University of the Arts (ZHdK)** offers a bachelor program in which students experience filmmaking from conception to screening. The master program deepens the study and practice of fiction and documentary filmmaking, screenwriting, photography, editing, and creative production.

The Lucerne University of Applied Sciences and Arts (HSLU) offers bachelor and master degree programs in animation and video. These programs focus on both animation and digital storytelling. The master program focuses on documentary film and experimental narrative forms.

The École cantonale d'art de Lausanne (ECAL) offers with its bachelor program an initiation into the various professions of filmmaking such as writing, directing, photography, sound, and post-production. The master program is aimed at developing a personal cinematic vision with a focus on fiction cinema.

The Geneva University of Art and Design (HEAD) offers a bachelor program aimed at exploring the diversity of film writing between documentary and fiction. The master program is focused on documentary cinema. ECAL and HEAD have created their master programs in partnership with one another.

The Università della Svizzera italiana (USI) has initiated a course on how to film architecture and inaugurated, in collaboration with the Locarno Film Festival, a Chair titled Future of Cinema and the Audiovisual Arts.

The International Academy of Audiovisual Sciences (CISA) of Locarno is a Higher Specialized School with a two-year program culminating in the diploma of Visual Designer, which is followed by a one-year specialization program with five majors (in directing, cinematography, sound, editing, creative production) that lead to the federal post-diploma qualification in filmmaking and television.

A Place for New Memories

In the run up to Locarno77, the Rotonda by la Mobiliare is the premiere destination for families and adults from the region, hosting a slate of artists and vendors whose presence and entertainment offerings will help build expectation for the region's biggest cultural event of the year. Once the Locarno Film Festival gets underway, the Rotonda is the one-of-a-kind space for relaxing between films, to take a break from the intensity and focus of the Festival's main program, and an unmissable nightly event to keep everybody entertained. From this year, the Rotonda will expand its already significant offering with additional programming for families, new spaces for guests, and tantalizing food offers from all around the world. Furthermore, an art-installation by Yann Gross will complete the experience of the Rotonda.

What's the Line-Up?

Some highlights of the line-up, conceived by the Locarno Film Festival and la Mobiliare, will include La Rappresentante di Lista, who will take the stage, followed by a DJ set by DJ Drago, in a special event co-presented by Rolling Stone Italia on August 2.

The musical line-up for the weekend of August 9 and 10 will be curated by RSI Radiotelevisione svizzera. It will start on Friday with a concert by **Dom Lampa** and his overwhelming energy, a journey through distant rhythms, reggae sounds and Brazilian roots music. This matic Swiss singer, songwriter and composer Bastian Baker, who will bring to the stage melody. On Saturday, August 10, stage to Italian singer-songwriter Ermal Meta, who will perform hits from his repertoire and songs from his latest album Buona Fortuna.

This year will also feature DJ Damante, Gianluca Grignani, Le Vibrazioni, Jay-K, and the Golden Vultures - more names will be announced later in July. An eclectic line-up overall, reflecting the Rotonda's commitment to remaining a space for all tastes and interests.

On August 1, la Rotonda will host a fundraising charity event to benefit the populations affected by storm that violently hit Vallemaggia in early July. The event will feature leading musicians from Ticino, who will take turns performing on stage from 4 PM to midnight.

In addition to the main acts, the music program - supported also by Stiftung Phonoproduzierende, Swissperform, enjoyArena, and riser., and Radio Ticino - will include a wealth of supporting artists who will keep the show going through all hours of the night, while the unplugged concert stage will host rising artists from all over Switzerland, thanks to the support of Mx3.

Also back for the second year in a row is the Club, a space with underground charm that is open every day until late at night, where after hours you can continue to enjoy DJ sets and entertainment.

The Festival Center is located in the Palazzo della Sopracenerina, an important historical building of the 19th century. In its courtyard, under a beautiful skylight built by world-renowned Swiss architect Mario Botta, you will find a small cafe and the Press Desk. Here you can pick up your accreditation as well as your welcome bag and your copy of the official catalogue. The Press Desk provides help with questions, requests for materials, press kits, and will also support you by submitting requests for interviews with Festival guests.

PRESS VILLAGE

This year, the Press Village will be located on the first floor of the Palazzo della Sopracenerina (above the Festival Center). Here, in the large hall, embellished with frescos and large windows overlooking the Piazza Grande, which was used as the press center during the Locarno Treaties of 1925, journalists and information operators will be able to follow Photocalls and Press Conferences. Also, its strategic position allows one to reach the Teatro Kursaal, PalaCinema, and, of course, Piazza Grande in just a few steps.

Press Conferences

Press Conferences with delegations from all the films presented in the Concorso Internazionale and shown in Piazza Grande will be held every day in the Conference Room of the Press Village.

Photocalls

Photocalls with delegations of the films presented in the Concorso Internazionale and shown in Piazza Grande, will be held at the Press Village, and are accessible to accredited photographers only.

PRESS SCREENINGS

Press screenings of the Concorso Internazionale, Concorso Cineasti del Presente, and Piazza Grande are accessible for both accredited press and industry. Priority access is given to the press in case the cinema reaches capacity. All the press screenings will take place at the Teatro Kursaal (Largo Zorzi 1, 6600 Locarno), except for the screenings from the Concorso Cineasti del Presente which will take place at the PalaCinema 3 Leopard Club (Piazza Remo Rossi 1, 6600 Locarno).





The Cinémathèque suisse at the Locarno Film Festival

Press release, Lausanne, July 10th, 2024

An unmissable annual event, the Locarno Film Festival is renewing its collaboration with the Cinémathèque suisse, which is contributing two recently restored Swiss films this summer and lending several prints from its collections.

Presented in competition in 1983, Marcel Schüpbach's *L'Allégement (The Unburdening)* will be screened as part of the "Histoire(s) du Cinéma - Cinéma Suisse Redécouvert" section, alongside Michel Soutter's *Repérages (Faces of Love,* 1977) starring Jean-Louis Trintignant, who died two years ago and to whom the Cinémathèque suisse paid tribute last year. Both films have been digitally restored with the support of Memoriav, and RTS for Michel Soutter's film.

Columbia Pictures retrospective

Partnering once again with the festival's retrospective, dedicated this year to the 100th anniversary of Columbia Pictures, the Cinémathèque suisse will also be paying tribute to the legendary Hollywood production company in its cinemas in September, with subsequent screenings at the Filmpodium Zurich, the Rex in Bern and other European institutions such as the Danish Film Institute (Copenhagen), the Filmoteca Española (Madrid), the Arsenal (Berlin), the Filmhaus Nürnberg and Eye Filmmuseum (Amstedam).

Cinémathèque suisse's Research and Archive Centre at Penthaz is also making a number of rare prints available for the festival's 35mm screenings. These include one film by Steven Spielberg, the Italian version of *E.T.* (1982) for the Prefestival evening in the Piazza Grande, as well as Jane Campion's *An Angel at My Table* (1990), winner of the Pardo d'Onore Manor 2024 award and the subject of a complete retrospective of her films in Lausanne, to be screened at the Capitole cinema beginning in September.

The 3 museums of PLATEFORME 10, MCBA (fine arts), mudac (design) and Photo Elysée are currently celebrating the 100 years of surrealism with 3 exhibitions. The surrealists loved to play with different art forms, from painting to photography. They were also among the first to understand the strength and creativity of cinema. To celebrate this, a special evening is devoted to surrealism in this year's selection with the screening of 2 films by the enfant terrible of French cinema, director Quentin Dupieux.
